Guided bird spotting walk with Christopher Hall Sunday 3 March, 10am

Meet at Nottingham Lakeside Arts Join Chris Hall from New Horizons, for a walk around University Park. Previous walks have encountered birds such as heron, goosander, great-crested grebe, peregrine falcon, buzzard, stock dove, great spotted and green woodpeckers, kingfisher, mistle thrush, goldcrest, nuthatch, treecreeper and coal tit. You might be surprised at the variety of birds here, and pick up a few bird sounds along the way. Fee £4 per person. Booking required.

Horticultural workshop Saturday 30 March, 10am

Meet at the Millennium Garden Learn how to plant bulbs in a form known as Planting in the Green. In this practical workshop, with help from the Friends of University Park and the University's Grounds team, create naturalising drifts of spring colour at the back of the Millennium Garden and into the woodland.
